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Interpreting Student Assessment Results from the Parent Portal

The Clark County School District values and appreciates the collaboration with parents in ensuring student success. Understanding how the results impact state and district educational requirements are key to your child's academic success. The following information assists with understanding what the results mean to your child's ability to master the Nevada Academic Content Standards while satisfying state regulations for collegeand-career readiness.

WIDA – English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA) Grades K-12

WIDA-ELPA results are displayed for the Language Domain and Composite-Overall, which is a combination of the Language Domain scores. The Result represents achievement levels, which range from 1.0 (beginner) to 6.0 (advanced).

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) Grades 3-8

SBAC results are displayed per test administration date for each Claim and English Language Arts/Literacy Overall and Math Overall results. The score determines the Achievement Level (Result). Levels are: 1-Minimal Understanding, 2-Partial Understanding, 3-Proficient, and 4-Advanced.

End of Course (EOC) Grades 7-12

EOC exams are district tests with results displayed as participation (P) or with a score. Results with scores will also have an achievement level (Result). Levels are: 1-Minimal Understanding, 2-Partial Understanding, 3-Proficient, and 4-Advanced. Level 2 is the state-approved level for earning a standard high school diploma.

Nevada Alternate Assessment (NAA) Grades 3-8 and 11

The NAA is the state assessment of alternate achievement standards. Levels are: 1-Emergent/Developing, 2-Approaches Standard, 3-Meets Standard, 4-Exceeds Standard.
